KC Solar Energy, opened water floating solar power plant at the 2nd ash treatment plant of Dangjin Thermal Power



Last October 25, there was an opening ceremony of water floating photovoltaic power plant at the 2nd ash treatment plant of Dangjin Thermal Power with 3.5MW which KC Solar Energy won the order from Korea East-west Power.

This project too for 4 months since its kick off in May and

was complete on September 18. The power plant is a facility contracted by using 'ash treatment idle water surface in the head quarter' where the combusted coal ash is landfilled in Dangjin Thermal Power Plant. It produces power that can be used for 1,600 households for a year and has green-house reduction effect of 1,700 ton. And, it is significant in that it is creative that removed any environmental deterioration and conflicts with local residents regarding the power plant construction.

Following the Boryeong Thermal's water floating photovoltaic power plant of 1,1MW last year, KC Solar Energy was successfully opening the large scale water floating power plant and will continue to make efforts to make a greater achievement in the water floating photovoltaic power plant bidding market which is growing fast (The end).
